THE ALBERTA HERITAGE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

ABORIGINAL HEALTH CAREERS BURSARY

VALUE: Determined by the Selection Committee

NUMBER: Variable

CONDITIONS & CRITERIA: Bursaries are available for aboriginal students in Alberta to pursue post-secondary education in a health field. Applicants must be Indian, Inuit or Métis and have been residents of Alberta for a minimum of three years prior to applying.

ELIGIBILITY: 80% or better average each high school year in the specified courses on the application. For example, if you only got the 80% in your Grade 10 year, you can still apply in your Grade 12 year to receive the money. Grade 10 students may receive \$400.00, grade 11 students \$800.00 and grade 12 students \$1,300.00 and the maximum value being \$2,500.00 for all three years.

For example, if you only got the 75% in your Grade 10 year, you can still apply in your Grade 12 year to receive the money. Grade 10 students may receive \$300.00, grade 11 students \$500.00 and grade 12 students \$700.00 and the maximum value being \$1,500.00 for all three years.

RUTHERFORD SCHOLARS

4-H SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

This year the Alberta 4-H Scholarship program will award over one hundred scholarships with a total value of more than \$80,000. By submitting **one** application, you will be considered for **ALL** of the Alberta 4-H scholarships for which you are eligible.

Each scholarship has a set of criteria that is determined by the scholarship sponsor. Your information is entered into a database when it is submitted. The database sorts out the names that meet the criteria for each scholarship. A council of representatives from various 4-H councils will review the applications and choose the scholarship recipients. Applicants may receive a maximum of one scholarship per year. Recipients will be notified in September about receipt of scholarship.

In addition there are also several other scholarships available at this site that students can apply for.
