As you may be aware, Premier Alison Redford re-instated funding to all School Divisions across the province. Prairie Rose received \$762 000 from the \$107 million returned to school boards. All schools in our division had the per pupil grant re-instated to equivalent levels as last year. These returned funds have boosted our budget and we now have a balanced budget similar to last year with no cuts in any classroom/department budget area.

Part of the returned grant was allocated to the previously reduced AISI budget line (Alberta Initiative for School Improvement). The school division is mandated to use allocated AISI dollars towards defined AISI projects that improve the education system within Prairie Rose. One such initiative for the remainder of this school year is building/supporting leadership capacity in the division with the implementation of a Division Principal position. The Division Principal will work through Central Office to provide leadership and support for all schools in the Division.

I have been selected as the Division Principal for PRSD commencing February 1st, 2012 to June 30th, 2012. I will be working out of central office for this time period and returning to Eagle Butte High School as Principal for the fall of 2012. In the interim, I am pleased to announce that Mark Heinrichs will take over as Acting Principal in my absence. Mark is completing his 6th year as Vice-Principal at Eagle Butte and will do an excellent job in his new position.

In conclusion, I encourage our students to stay focused over the next 14 days in December. I know the teachers will be using their classroom time wisely to finish important curriculum prior to the break.

On behalf of the staff at Eagle Butte High School, we wish our students, parents and community a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Letter to Parents of Students Writing Diploma Exams

Re: Inclement Weather, School Closure and Diploma Exams

In the case of school closure during Diploma exams, the school will remain open for *town* students and those rural students who are *safely (parent decision)* able to reach the school to write the exam. If a student is unable to reach the school to write a Diploma exam, their parents must contact the Principal who will then decide on a case by case basis as to what the options are. The following may occur:

1. If the student is late getting to the exam, the starting time can be delayed for up to one hour only. This late privilege would only be granted by the Principal if there are extenuating circumstances beyond the control of the student. This student would then receive the full amount of time allotted for completion of the exam. All students must remain in the examination area for the first hour of the exam.
2. The student may write the missed exam in June or August.
3. The student may be exempted from the exam. If a Diploma exam is not written, it is indicated on the student's transcripts. Alberta Learning is not aware of any University faculties discriminating against students because they did not write the exam. Students should have the same chance of being accepted as if they would have written the Diploma exam. The student's final mark will be calculated by giving the Teacher awarded mark for any of the missing parts. If both parts were missed, 100% of the final mark would be Teacher awarded. If the student is exempted from either of the parts, they will be given the Teacher awarded mark for that part.

Office of the Minister

Interested Members of the Public:

As the new Minister of Education, I want to provide you with the opportunity to share your views about education in Alberta. Since the introduction of the proposed Education Act in April 2011, much has changed. Our government has made a renewed commitment to the education system, and it is important to confirm that we are indeed moving in a direction that reflects the desires and wishes of Albertans.

On November 15, I announced the opportunity for public input as we begin to review the proposed Education Act. The first component is a series of seven full-day meetings, called *Our Children, Our Future: Getting It Right*, scheduled for late November and early December 2011.

The new Education Act must support and sustain learning environments in which students can thrive through flexible, personalized learning. By opening discussion to the public, especially to students, we can ensure this legislation reflects Albertans' vision for their education system and that it has a direct and positive impact on Alberta classrooms now and for years to come.

Many of the ideas emphasized in the earlier draft will likely carry forward because it:

- *enables school boards to be more responsive to local needs;
- * engages students from Kindergarten to graduation;
- *better supports inclusion of learners with differing needs, cultures and abilities; and
- *ensures that schools are caring, respectful and safe environments all remain important priorities for this government.

I invite you to attend one of the scheduled meetings identified below. I also ask you to encourage participation among others in your community for whom the meetings would be a new experience by passing along this information.

We have invited community leaders and education authorities to attend the meetings, however, the vast majority of registrations are being held for students, parents, teachers and others who have a broad interest in education - as learners, as taxpayers and as future employers.

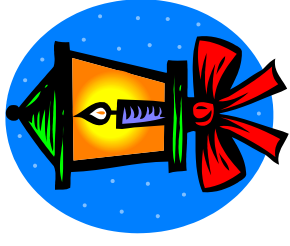

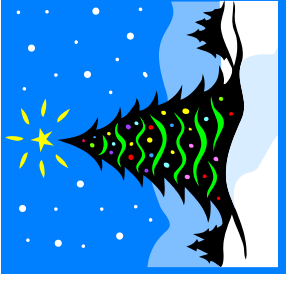

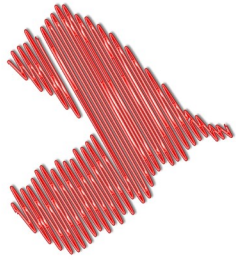
